



## **Upper West to East Transmission Line Frequently Asked Questions**

### **What is the Upper West to East (UW2E) Transmission Line?**

- The UW2E Transmission Line is an underground waterline that will move water between Widefield Water & Sanitation District's second booster station and the Goldfield Tank Farm.

### **Why is Widefield Water and Sanitation District (WWSD) building this line?**

- Constructing this water line is part of WWSD's commitment to providing reliable water service that meets strict quality and environmental standards. This line will increase water transmission capacity and will ensure the District is able to safely and reliably meet customer demands.

### **When will construction of the UW2E line begin?**

- Construction is set to begin in November 2022. We will provide exact dates as we get closer to groundbreaking.

### **How long will construction last?**

- Construction will take place in three phases and is expected to last approximately 120 days. As with any construction, unforeseen delays may extend the duration of the project.

### **Will I lose access to my street and/or driveway during construction?**

- Residents of certain streets (see map on next page) will have street and/or driveway access temporarily restricted during construction. Residents will have access to their streets and driveways each day in the evenings and early morning hours when construction is not taking place.

### **Will access to my street and/or driveway be impacted during the entire 120-day construction process?**

- No. Construction will take place in phases, and street/driveway access will be restricted only as long as the crew is working in that area. For most residents, restricted access to their street and/or driveway is expected to last no more than one week.

### **Will construction take place all throughout the day?**

- Construction will take place between 7:00 am and 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday.

### **Will my water and/or wastewater services be interrupted?**

- We do not expect there to be interruptions to water and wastewater services. If it becomes necessary to temporarily interrupt services, affected residents will receive notification 48 hours in advance. Service interruptions, when necessary, will only take place between 9 am and 3 pm.
